

NATIONAL CONGRESSIONAL TERM LIMITS POLL: EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Nation Survey Conducted March 1, 2021 by McLaughlin and Associates

Survey Summary: The results of our recently completed national survey show that voters overwhelmingly support implementing term limits on members of Congress. Support for term limits is broad and strong across all political, geographic and demographic groups.

An overwhelming 80% of voters approve of a Constitutional Amendment that will place term limits on members of Congress. Half of all voters, 50%, say they would be more likely to support a member of Congress who has been opposed to congressional term limits during their 20 year career in office but suddenly announced that their views had evolved and they now supported term limits. Approximately 4-in-10 voters, 38%, say they are more likely to support Joe Biden if he said his views have evolved and he now supported term limits for Congress.

Conclusions:

American voters overwhelmingly support placing term limits on members of Congress. The support for term limits is strong, broad and intense and boosts support for elected officials who would vote to implement term limits on members of Congress.

Methodology:

This survey of 1,000 general election voters nationwide was conducted February 24th through the 28th. All interviews were conducted online; survey invitations were distributed randomly within predetermined geographic units. These units were structured to correlate with actual voter turnout in the general election. This poll of 1,000 general election voters has an accuracy of +/- 3.1% at a 95% confidence interval.
