Methodology

The survey of 500 Registered Voters in California-53 was conducted online by RMG Research, Inc. from July 27-August 2, 2020. Respondents were selected at random from voter lists and through a Random Digital Engagement process. Certain quotas were applied, and the overall sample was lightly weighted by gender, age, race, education, and political party to reasonably reflect the district's population of Registered Voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population.
