

NEW YORK CITY MAYORAL TERM LIMITS POLL: EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

New York City 500 Registered Voters Conducted Conducted December 18-22, 2020 by RMG Research, Inc.

Survey Summary: The results of this recently completed New York City-wide survey show that NYC voters overwhelmingly support term limits for mayor of New York City, Governor and the state legislature. Support for term limits is broad across all political and demographic groups. An overwhelming sixty-seven percent of voters approve of 8-year term limits for mayor while only fifteen percent support a twelve-year term limit. Seventy-seven percent of those surveyed support enacting 8-year term limits for the Governor of New York and seventy-five percent support implementing 8-year term limits on the state legislature.

Currently, term limits on the New York City mayor and City Council members prevent anyone from serving more than eight years in an office. A proposal has been made to lengthen the limit so that the Mayor and council members can serve for up to 12 years. Do you prefer term limits of 8 years or 12 years?

Conclusions: New York City voters overwhelmingly support term limits on the New York City mayor, governor, and the New York state legislature. The preferred length of term limits for each of these positions is a total of eight years. In addition, respondents indicate that they are more likely to vote for a mayoral candidate who protects and defends eight-year term limits on the office of New York City Mayor. Support for term limits is broad across all political and demographic groups.

Methodology: The survey of 500 Registered Voters in New York City was conducted online by RMG Research, Inc. from December 18-22, 2020. Respondents were selected at random from voter lists and contacted via text or through a Random Digital Engagement process. Certain quotas were applied, and the overall sample was lightly weighted by gender, age, race, and political party to reasonably reflect the city's population of Registered Voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population.
