Winning Jobs Narrative Architecture

5 Key Elements:

- Center and lead with working people—the heroes—so they hear that they are our priority.
- Value and support work to connect around deeply held shared values.
- Situate working people as the engines of our economy—the logic model for our policies.
- Position government in a supporting (not starring) role, so that we respect and center personal agency.
- Relate policy to the broader economy and broad benefits, to remind people that we're focused on the economy and shared prosperity.

- Online survey of 7,690 likely voters nationwide, conducted
 Sept. 27-28, 2022 by Blue Rose Research
- 26 messages (and 4 far-right oppo messages) tested against control group to see movement on two dependent variables:
 - Generic Congressional Horse Race
 - (Agree/Disagree) "Economic policies supported by Democrats would help people like me."

Our Testing Approaches

- Different takes on message approaches
- Variations of phrases/language within messages
- All tested messages begin with the same preamble:

"Economic policies supported by Democrats would help people like me."



Context to Understand This Message Test

- The purpose of this test was not to inform messaging for proactive advocacy related to immigrant rights. Immigrant rights advocates understand best how to frame the immigration debate and have provided excellent guidance in *The Ultimate Messaging Guide to Winning the Immigration Narrative*, available by contacting research@caimmigrant.org. Also worth noting: inquire with your state C3 or C4 table for access to national immigration voter models.
- This test, instead, is intended to focus more squarely on immigration within an electoral context, and advocates who helped develop *The Ultimate Guide* cooperated with the WJN team. The Extreme Right playbook of stoking anxiety around immigration as a political wedge is not new, and shows no sign of ending. And there is no clear shared strategy among progressives about how best to contend with those attacks.
- In this test, we explored whether the WJN architecture could be effectively invoked to frame immigration, and perceptions of immigrants. More work needs to be done, but we believe this test indicates that progressive leaders can share a positive vision for immigration within a framework that still centers working families and their key priorities keeping voters top priorities front and center.



Key Learnings

- Immigration is a complex issue, one that is often used to divide and polarize voters and stoke fears about scarcity. However, all messages in this test performed either positively or neutrally compared to the placebo. None provoked backlash overall.
- 2. Messages that broadly linked immigration to the health and growth of our economy, working people, and contribution performed best—just as they did in our previous test on student debt relief. Immigration is at the nexus of economic, culture, and security concerns. Not only is it a false choice to say that people have to choose between Economic or Social Issues, but on many topics that distinction itself is a false construct.
- 3. Message performance was largely consistent across demographics. The only notable difference involved age, with messages performing considerably better with younger voters (18-34) compared to older voters (65+). The latter was the main place where we saw negative movement vis a vis our messages.



Key Learnings (cont'd)

4. Immigration messages that included "villain" framing were less effective than those that did not. The only message in the top 10 that included a villain referred to "extreme Republicans." The messages that referred to "MAGA Republicans" placed in the bottom half of those tested, and in the 7th and 12th percentiles of messages tested by Blue Rose Research during the current cycle.

Broader Agenda + Contribution

Democrats are doing exactly that with new laws that lower the costs of healthcare, energy, and education for hardworking families and rebuild our supply chains here in America.

They're also working to fix our immigration system. Immigrants contribute to and invest in local communities—and a just, humane (SPLIT: orderly/functional) immigration system is an important part of building a healthy and growing economy for us all.

We tested four opposition messages. On vote choice, this was among five pro-immigration messages that outperformed the best testing opposition message. Three additional messages tied the best testing opposition message in terms of movement on vote choice.

Framing Keys

- 1) Connect immigration within a broader agenda focused on making sure working families have the tools and opportunities to build a good life—including key legislative accomplishments like lowering healthcare and energy costs, and rebuilding supply chains.
- **2)** With policies like student debt relief or policies relating to immigration status, it is important to **make** clear that the entire economy, and the population overall, benefits. Short statements, like "immigration is part of a healthy, growing economy" help with making this connection.
- **3)** Focus on asset based framing when referencing immigrant families, including all the ways they contribute to the economy and country. This challenges right-wing narratives without having to acknowledge them and mitigates zero-sum anxieties.
- 4) Acknowledge that the immigration system is not functioning well and needs to be fixed for the sake of immigrant families and the country as a whole.
- 5) Alluding to bipartisanship may help reduce anxieties, whereas politicizing immigration may elevate those anxieties.
