
Support for Stimulus Remains High As More Hear About It



Independents, Service Industry Workers, Women, and Rural Americans Least Likely to Have Heard About Stimulus

Additionally, 2020 Trump voters, younger Americans, non-college educated Americans, and people making less than \$50,000 annually are more likely to say they have heard "a little" or "nothing" about the package.

How much have you seen, read, or heard about President Biden and his emergency legislative package called the "American Rescue Plan"?






Bipartisan Majorities View a Variety of Policies in the "American Rescue Plan" as Important to Economy

More than three in five Democrats, independents, and Republicans rate each proposal as important to the economy.

At least 59% of 2020 Trump voters rate each as important, including 67% who say so of the \$1,400 checks.

Range of Progressive Messaging Rebutting Concerns About **Costs of the Stimulus Package Are All Effective**

Messaging focused on specifics of the bill, the emotional toll of the pandemic, and urgency all are effective. Which do you agree with more?

Statement 1: Those who say that the American Rescue Plan is a liberal wish list of spending that will balloon the national deficit.



Stimulus Package and Vaccines Dominate Positive Conversation on Biden

More than nine in ten Democrats (95%), 72% of independents, and 51% of Republicans report having heard "mostly positive" or "a mix of positive and negative" things on Biden in the last few days.

"The vaccine and the stimulus that can help people like us."




Biden's Ratings on Economy Climb After Passage of Stimulus

Biden's net approval rating on the economy has improved 6 points since March 1st.

 His net approval rating improved by 11 points among Republicans (from -69 to -58) and by 9 points among Black Americans (from +71 to +80) since March 1st.

Do you approve or disapprove of the way Joe Biden is handling the economy?






Biden and Democrats More Trusted On Range of Issues Related to Economy, Recovery, and Pandemic

About the Study

Global Strategy Group conducted public opinion surveys among a sample of 1,001 registered voters from March 11-March 15, 2021. 101 additional interviews were conducted among Hispanic voters. 67 additional interviews were conducted among Asian American and Pacific Islander voters. 105 additional interviews were conducted among African American voters. 103 additional interviews were conducted among independent voters. The survey was conducted online, recruiting respondents from an opt-in online panel vendor. Respondents were verified against a voter file and special care was taken to ensure the demographic composition of our sample matched that of the national registered voter population across a variety of demographic variables.
