

# What Vaccines Does My Horse Need?

## A Guide to Properly Protecting Your Horse

All horses should be vaccinated every spring against the 5 core diseases.<sup>1</sup>

### Rabies – 100% fatal<sup>1</sup>

Acquired through the bite of an infected animal.



### Tetanus – 75% fatal<sup>1</sup>

Caused by bacteria present in soil that can contaminate open wounds.



### Eastern Equine Encephalomyelitis – 90% fatal<sup>1</sup>

Transmitted to horses by mosquitoes that have fed on infected wild birds.



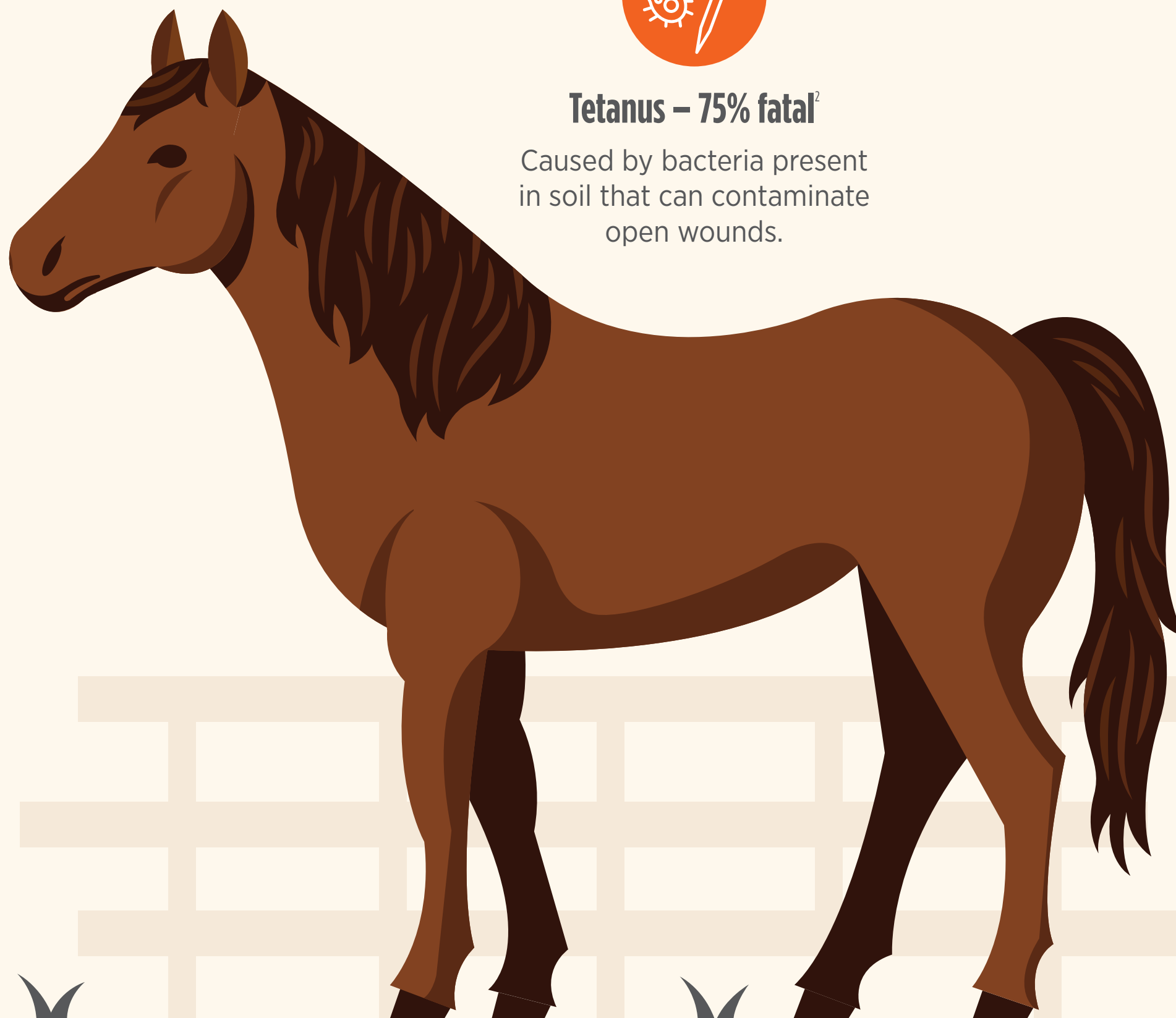
### West Nile – 33% fatal<sup>1</sup>

Acquired through the bite of a mosquito that previously fed on an infected bird.



### Western Equine Encephalomyelitis – 50% fatal<sup>1</sup>

Like Eastern equine encephalomyelitis, transmitted through the bite of an infected mosquito.



## Other important vaccinations needed based on your horse's unique lifestyle.



### Equine Influenza

- Travels
- Contact with horses that travel
- Geriatric



### Equine Herpesvirus

- Travels
- Contact with horses that travel
- Boarded
- Geriatric
- Pregnant mare (5th, 7th and 9th month of pregnancy)



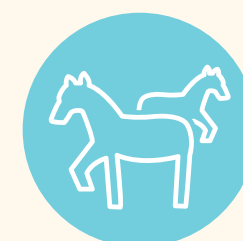
### Strangles

- Property has a history of strangles
- Weanling and yearling



### Leptospirosis

- Lives near a standing body of water
- Near wildlife
- Draft, Warmblood or Appaloosa horse
- Nearby cases of equine recurrent uveitis\*
- Nearby cases of Lepto-related abortion\*



### Equine Rotavirus

- Pregnant mare (8th, 9th and 10th month of pregnancy)
- Will be bred this year



### Potomac Horse Fever

- Grazes near irrigated pastures, freshwater creeks or rivers
