February 23, 2021, Introduced by Reps. Manoogian, Bellino, Mueller, LaGrand, Witwer, Tyrone Carter, Tate, Sabo, Hertel and Haadsma and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending section 602b (MCL 257.602b), as amended by 2016 PA 332.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 602b. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a
 person shall not read, manually type, or send a text message on a
- 3 wireless 2-way communication use a mobile electronic device that is
- 4 located in the person's hand or in the person's lap, including a
- 5 wireless telephone used in cellular telephone service or personal

- 1 communication service, while operating a motor vehicle or a school
- 2 bus. that is moving on a highway or street in this state. As used
- 3 in this subsection, a wireless 2-way communication device does not
- 4 include a global positioning or navigation system that is affixed
- 5 to the motor vehicle. This subsection does not apply to a person
- 6 operating a commercial vehicle.
- 7 (2) Subsection (1) does not apply to any of the following 8 situations:
- 9 (a) A law enforcement officer, firefighter, emergency medical
- 10 technician, paramedic, operator of an authorized emergency vehicle,
- 11 or similarly engaged paid or volunteer public safety first
- 12 responder during the performance of that person's official duties,
- 13 and a public utility employee or contractor acting within the scope
- 14 of that person's employment when responding to a public utility
- 15 emergency.
- 16 (b) The use of a mobile electronic device for emergency
- 17 purposes, including a text messaging device to contact a 9-1-1
- 18 system, or an emergency call to a law enforcement agency, health
- 19 care provider, fire department, or other emergency services agency
- 20 or entity to report to appropriate authorities a fire, traffic
- 21 accident, serious road hazard, or medical or hazardous materials
- 22 emergency; to report the operator of another motor vehicle who is
- 23 driving in a reckless or otherwise unsafe manner or who appears to
- 24 be driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs; or to report a
- 25 crime.
- 26 (c) The use of a global positioning or navigation system
- 27 feature of a mobile electronic device if information is not entered
- 28 by hand into the global positioning or navigation system feature of
- 29 the mobile electronic device.

1 (d) Reading, selecting, or entering a telephone number or name 2 in a mobile electronic device for the purpose of making or 3 receiving a telephone call or if a person otherwise activates or 4 deactivates a feature or function of a mobile electronic device.

- (e) The use of a mobile electronic device in a voice-operated or hands-free mode if the operator of the motor vehicle does not use his or her hands to operate the device, except to activate or deactivate a feature or function of the mobile electronic device or the use of a mobile electronic device that is integrated into a motor vehicle and utilizes the user interfaces that are permanently installed into the motor vehicle.
- (3) A person shall not operate a motor vehicle or school bus while wearing headphones or earphones in both ears simultaneously for the purposes of listening to music, video, or other sound broadcasts.
- 16 (4) A person shall not operate a motor vehicle or school bus 17 while accessing, reading, or posting to a social networking site.
 - (5) A person shall not operate a motor vehicle or school bus while viewing, recording, or transmitting a video on a mobile electronic device.
 - shall not read, manually type, or send a text message on a wireless 2-way communication device that is located in the person's hand or in the person's lap, including a wireless telephone used in cellular telephone service or personal communication service, while operating a commercial motor vehicle or a school bus on a highway or street in this state. As used in this subsection, a wireless "wireless 2-way communication device" means a mobile telephone as that term is defined in 49 CFR 390.5. Wireless 2-way communication

- 1 device does not include a global positioning or navigation system
- 2 that is affixed to the commercial motor vehicle. or school bus.
- 3 (7) (3) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a person
- 4 shall not use a hand-held mobile telephone to conduct a voice
- 5 communication while operating a commercial motor vehicle or a
- 6 school bus on a highway, including while temporarily stationary due
- 7 to traffic, a traffic control device, or other momentary delays.
- 8 This subsection does not apply if the operator of the commercial
- 9 vehicle or school bus has moved the vehicle to the side of, or off,
- 10 a highway and has stopped in a location where the vehicle can
- 11 safely remain stationary. As used in this subsection, "mobile
- 12 telephone" means that term as defined in 49 CFR 390.5. Mobile
- 13 telephone does not include a 2-way radio service or citizens band
- 14 radio service. As used in this subsection, "use a hand-held mobile
- 15 telephone" means 1 or more of the following:
- 16 (a) Using at least 1 hand to hold a mobile telephone to
- 17 conduct a voice communication.
- (b) Dialing or answering a mobile telephone by pressing more
- 19 than a single button.
- (c) Reaching for a mobile telephone in a manner that requires
- 21 a driver to maneuver so that he or she is no longer in a seated
- 22 driving position, restrained by a seat belt that is installed as
- 23 required by 49 CFR 393.93 and adjusted in accordance with the
- 24 vehicle manufacturer's instructions.
- 25 (8) $\frac{(4)}{(4)}$ Subsections $\frac{(1)}{(2)}$, (6) and $\frac{(3)}{(7)}$ do not apply to
- 26 an individual who is using a device described in subsection $\frac{(1)}{(6)}$
- 27 or $\frac{(3)}{(7)}$ to do any of the following:
- 28 (a) Report a traffic accident, medical emergency, or serious
- 29 road hazard.

- (b) Report a situation in which the person believes his or her
 personal safety is in jeopardy.
- 3 (c) Report or avert the perpetration or potential perpetration4 of a criminal act against the individual or another person.
- (d) Carry out official duties as a police officer, law
 enforcement official, member of a paid or volunteer fire
 department, or operator of an emergency vehicle.
- (e) Operate or program the operation of an automated motor
 vehicle while testing or operating the automated motor vehicle
 without a human operator while the automated driving system is
 engaged.
- 12 (5) Subsection (1) does not apply to a person using an on-
- (9) (6) An Except as provided in subsection (10), an
 individual who violates this section is responsible for a civil infraction and shall must be ordered to pay a civil fine, community
 service, or both, as follows:
- 18 (a) For a first violation, \$100.00 or 16 hours of community19 service.
- 20 (b) For a second or subsequent violation, \$200.00.\$250.00 or
 21 24 hours of community service, or both.
- 22 (10) If an individual is involved in an accident at the time 23 the individual violates this section, the civil fine ordered must 24 be double the amount under subsection (9) and a law enforcement 25 officer investigating the accident shall indicate in a written 26 accident report that the individual was using a mobile electronic 27 device at the time of the accident.
- (11) (7) This section supersedes all local ordinances
 regulating the use of a communications mobile electronic device

- 1 while operating a motor vehicle in motion on a highway or street,
- 2 except that a unit of local government may adopt an ordinance or
- 3 enforce an existing ordinance substantially corresponding to this
- 4 section.
- 5 (12) A court may suspend an individual's driver license for
- 6 not more than 90 days if the individual is responsible for 3 or
- 7 more civil infractions under this section within a 3-year period.
- 8 (13) A law enforcement officer enforcing this section may
- 9 treat a violation of this section as the primary or sole reason for
- 10 issuing a citation to a driver. A law enforcement officer shall not
- 11 search a motor vehicle or the driver or passenger in the motor
- 12 vehicle solely because of a violation of this section.
- 13 (14) Except as otherwise provided in this section, as used in
- 14 this section:
- 15 (a) "Mobile electronic device" means any handheld or portable
- 16 electronic device capable of providing wireless data or voice
- 17 communication between 2 or more individuals or amusement, including
- 18 a cellular telephone; broadband personal communication device; 2-
- 19 way messaging device; text messaging device; pager; electronic
- 20 device that can receive or transmit text or character-based images,
- 21 access or store data, or connect to the internet; personal digital
- 22 assistant; laptop computer; computer tablet; stand-alone computer;
- 23 portable computing device; mobile device with a touchscreen display
- 24 that is designed to be worn; electronic game; equipment that is
- 25 capable of playing a video, taking photographs, capturing images,
- 26 or recording or transmitting video; and any similar device that is
- 27 readily removable from a vehicle and is used to write, send, or
- 28 read text or data or capture images or video through manual input.
- 29 Mobile electronic device does not include a radio designed for the

- 1 Citizens Band Service or the Amateur Radio Service of the Federal
- 2 Communications Commission or a commercial 2-way radio
- 3 communications device or equipment permanently installed in a motor
- 4 vehicle.
- 5 (b) "Operate" means to drive or assume physical control of a
- 6 motor vehicle on a public way, street, road, or highway, including
- 7 operation while temporarily stationary because of traffic, road
- 8 conditions, a traffic light, or a stop sign. Operate does not
- 9 include a motor vehicle that is lawfully parked or an automated
- 10 vehicle with an SAE level 4 or 5 automated driving system that
- 11 performs dynamic driving tasks in automated mode as referenced in
- 12 the Society of Automotive Engineers, Inc. International Standard
- 13 J3016, 2014 edition.
- 14 (c) "Social networking site" means any web-based service that
- 15 allows individuals to construct a profile within a founded system
- 16 and communicate with other users of the site for social or
- 17 amusement purposes.
- 18 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 19 after the date it is enacted into law.
- 20 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 21 unless both of the following bills of the 101st Legislature are
- 22 enacted into law:
