RE: Administrative Order to Address Safe Drinking Water Act Violation at Bureau of Indian Affairs

Chemawa Indian School Public Water System, PWS ID #104101132

Dear Mr. Mercier:

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has determined that a violation of the Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA) has occurred at the public water system referenced above ("System") and an Administrative Compliance Order is necessary to protect public health. Enclosed you will find the Unilateral Administrative Compliance Order, which sets forth the violations at the System and requires the Bureau of Indian Affairs, as owner and operator of the System, to comply with the SDWA.

Pursuant to the enclosed Order, BIA has the opportunity to confer with EPA. The purpose and scope of the conference is to discuss the issues that BIA would like EPA to consider in connection to the Order. BIA's request must be received within three days of the receipt of the Order. Any such conference will be held no later than 10 days after receipt of the Order unless a different date is confirmed by EPA. Requests for an opportunity to confer shall be submitted to:

Failure to comply with the Order may subject BIA to a civil penalty of up to but not more than \$38,954 per day per violation, pursuant to Section 1447(b)(2) of the SDWA, 42 U.S.C. § 300j-6(b)(2) and 40 C.F.R. § 19.4. Keep in mind that the System must not only comply with the terms of the Order but also all other applicable SDWA requirements. The EPA may pursue additional enforcement actions for other SDWA violations not included in the Order.
